Since 1979, the Lakes Region Conservation Trust (LRCT) has protected more than 17,000 acres of shore frontage, islands, forests, and mountaintops, including the 5,500-acre Castle in the Clouds property. LRCT has established a separate subsidiary organization, the Castle Preservation Society (CPS), to be responsible for the operation and management of Castle in the Clouds and related buildings and grounds.
